Adaline C. Ruckdeschel was born Adaline L. Carlson in 1926 in Spencer, Iowa. She grew up in a farming family in Spencer and later in St. Hilaire, Minnesota. In 1944, after graduating from high school in St. Hilaire, she enrolled in the US Army Cadet Nursing Program, completing the program at Swedish Hospital in Minneapolis with a nursing degree in 1947. She worked as a nurse in Minneapolis, MN, Thomasville, GA, and Schenectady, NY, ending her nursing career as a Registered Nurse Anesthetist. In 1956 she married Robert S. (Bob) Ruckdeschel at Zion Lutheran Church in Schenectady, and moved to Ballston Lake, NY. There she and her husband raised three children: Lisa, Robert, and Thomas. They also operated Glenville Auto Sales, an auto sales and repair business. Along the way she also found time to play in a bridge club and a bowling league, square dance, and volunteer for the Red Cross Bloodmobile. She also loved movies and music, and was a lifelong piano player. In 1989 they retired to Cocoa, FL, and in 1990 she was widowed when a cancer took Bob. She continued to live in Cocoa, next door to her son Robert until 2014, when she moved to a nursing home in Merritt Island, FL. There she passed quietly from this world on February 4th, 2017. Throughout her life, and even during these last years at the nursing home, her caring, strength, wit, and intellect endeared her to so many with whom she came in contact. She was a truly kind soul, and a valued and trusted confidant to family, friends, acquaintances, and even strangers. She is survived by her daughter Lisa Ruckdeschel, son Robert Ruckdeschel,
