Dr. Alvin F. Weigel, of Canaveral Groves, passed away, with family by his side, on December 1, 2017 after a long battle with Parkinson's Disease. He was born in Lapeer, Michigan to Gordon and Dorothy Weigel, on December 10, 1935. After completing an apprenticeship at General Motors Institute, he moved to Brevard County in the early sixties, where he was instrumental in setting up the Machine Shop in the new Vocational Division at Brevard Junior College. He continued his education earning a BS in Vocational Education from Florida State University, an MS from North Carolina State University and a Doctorate in Educational Administration from Nova University. He was "Doc" to the thousands of students he taught in his 37 years at Brevard Community College, where he also spent many years as Chairman of the Vocational/Technical Division.
