



Mrs. Barbara Ann Turner-Griffith

November 4, 1936 - August 8, 2021

Cocoa, FL – Barbara Ann Turner Griffith, a retired Chase Manhattan Bank employee, died on Sunday, August 8, at Rockledge Regional Medical Center at the age of 84.

Born in Norfolk, VA to Andrew Turner and Idell Cornick, Barbara and her husband of 15 years, the late Rev. Rudolph K. Griffith, moved from Brooklyn, NY to Brevard County, FL in 1995. Barbara was a devoted member of the Glory of God Anglican Church, an active participant in bible study and prayer ministry programs as well as a generous community & civic volunteer. Mrs. Griffith was a lifelong learner who excelled as a student dating back to her days at Booker T. Washington High School in VA . Never one to be deterred by obstacles, Barbara remained an avid reader, music lover, and passionate gospel singer throughout a vibrant and happy life centered around God, country and family.

Survivors include her younger sisters, Thelma L. Holmes of Irvington, NJ (husband, Charles Holmes) and Diana P. Turner of Norfolk, VA, along with niece Joycelyn Harris (son, Alvin; daughter, Kim) and nephews Michael Turner (wife, Juanita; daughter, Michelle), Frederick Turner (daughter, Angelica), Steven Turner and Darryl Turner. Predeceasing Mrs. Griffith's passing were nephews Andrew and Douglas Holmes.
