“ Dawnia has been my friend and fellow organic food co-oper since her older boys were little. When I had health problems in 2010, she faithfully drove 45 minutes both ways, to pick up our orders and then deliver mine to my house, always with two or three of the kids along. I will be forever grateful.

Being busy mom's etc. we looked forward to seeing each other on Co-op delivery days and would always talk a little too long in one another's kitchen or driveway, not wanting it to end. Often Dawnia would still have to make a delivery or two to old or sick friends she was looking out for, along with taking the kids to their activities. Her children have learned from the life lesson and do all the heavy lifting now, and cheerfully put my boxes of food into my car for me countless times.

Dawnia and i joked about the day when we could relax and sit around sipping our tea or coffee, but I don't know that she really would have enjoyed that, because she was a doer and would rather be making soap or organizing the house if she had the energy. When she did something she did it wholeheartedly and well. I was amazed at and loved all of her Etsy store products. I'm quite selfishly missing them already....but not nearly as much as I'm going to miss her through the years. It means so much in this life to have friends who are always interested in how your life is going and how you're really doing.

I took Dawnia to some of her radiation and IV treatments the past couple of months. They were in Tampa and Orlando so we had a long time to talk and talk we did. I'm very thankful she felt good enough to enjoy the fellowship time. Dawnia didn't like that the radiation was causing her amazingly thick hair to thin, and I would tease her showing her my ponytail was still 1/3 as thick as hers, likewise my bird legs served to reassure her as she lost muscle in hers! ;-) I always enjoyed her ironic sense of humor.

Twice we talked for hours about our unspeakably and amazingly

wonderful creator and savior, and about the details of His plans for us that He began revealing so long ago and has been ever faithful to. I love how so many of the prophecies in the old testament have already been fulfilled, and Dawnia wanted to know all I could remember. Just saying all of it and really thinking about it again gave both of us great comfort and assurance that it is all real and Jesus really is the God of the living and not of the dead like He said. We who strive to follow in His example are never going to really die, just change places, body's, and circumstances always covered in His love.

A statistic about these prophecies popped into my head and I'm sharing it in hopes it might give you a little reassurance if you're missing Dawnia and wondering. 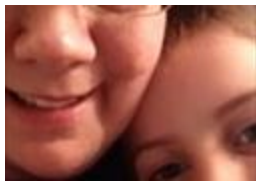

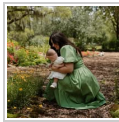
