



Mr. Herbert Greig Lindner

December 28, 1930 - June 2, 2024

Greig Lindner passed away peacefully on Sunday, June 2nd, 2024, surrounded by family, in Titusville, Florida. Greig was born in 1930 in Hays, Kansas. He is survived by his daughter Michele (Pete) Marti, as well as five grandchildren, Marie (Ryan) White and great-grandchildren Caleb, Luke, Micah and Emmarie; Michael Marti (Dr. Mark McCarthy); Matthew Marti; Mark (Emily) Marti and great-granddaughter McKinley; Mariah (David) Hudec and great-grandchildren David Jr. and Alley; and by his nephew Michael Tooley (Brenda) and the children and grandchildren of his niece Keila Fallon (Dan). He was preceded in death by his parents, Frank and Pauline Lindner, wife, Geraldine, son, Stephen Lindner, and niece, Keila Fallon.

Greig Lindner and Geraldine Morris married in 1958. Greig graduated from Fort Hays State University with a B.A. in psychology and philosophy in 1957 and with a M.S. in experimental psychology in 1958. Greig's career as a scientist and engineer took him first to San Diego, and then to Pittsburgh, St. Louis, and finally Titusville, Florida.

As an associate research scientist with the American Institute for Research immediately after graduate school (1958-1963) and as a McDonnell Douglas Aerospace human factors engineer for much of his life (1964-1991), Greig participated in developing and implementing procedures and analytical techniques to improve operational efficiency and safety. One outcome of his

work, the creation of optimal layout and placement of personnel and equipment for Strategic Air Command, helped to improve infrastructure for large Data Processing Centers for national security. In the 1990s, after the move to Florida, he worked as a human factors engineer for NASA at the Kennedy Space Center.

Greig retired in 1995. In retirement, he enjoyed time with his daughter, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, putting family at the center of his life. He found many opportunities to pursue interests in scuba diving, boating, fishing and hunting with local friends; he maintained close friendships throughout his life with former college classmates across the country and cherished an ongoing connection with friends in Hays, Kansas, for which he felt great affection as his childhood home. He was a devoted Christian who attended Indian River City United Methodist Church in Titusville. He found great comfort in his faith.

Greig was a beloved son, brother, husband, father and uncle. He was loved by all in his family and by a wide circle of friends. He will be very much missed. Our memories of him are a blessing to us.
