Pamela June (Phifer) Woolard, a long-time resident of Merritt Island, passed peacefully into Our Savior's arms on August 21, 2024.

Pam had just celebrated sixty years of marriage to her loving husband Lynn Phillip Woolard on August 16, 2024. They brought Lynn Phillip Woolard II, "Phil", and Rebecca Lea Woolard into this world. Born in Mountain Home, Arkansas on April 2, 1944, Pam was the first-born of Boyce Elden and Nora Maude (Graves) Phifer. Pam was the first baby born in the government hospital at the Norfolk Dam where her father served as a Civil Engineer. Pam graduated from Conway High School, Conway, Arkansas in 1962 and attended Arkansas State Teachers College. Leaving Arkansas in August 1964 with her new husband, Lynn, who was enrolled in the University of Tennessee Law School, Knoxville, she worked as the Girl Friday for Tennessee Press.

In the fall of 1966, Lynn graduated from the U.S. Air Force Officer Training School and Pam returned to the Phifers' Conway home until rejoining Lynn during his technical training. As a brand-new Second Lieutenant's wife, Pam was active in the Chanute AFB Officers Wives Club. The young couple was then assigned to Little Rock AFB, Arkansas upon Lynn's graduation as an Aircraft Maintenance Officer. Pam loved being their homemaker and continued her Officers Wives Club activities.
