Was the first son of Sidney J. Warren Sr and the 3rd child of Mr. Warren and the 3rd son for Mrs. Marjorie (Burt's Webb) Warren

He was raised in Orlando and Fort Myers, Florida

Sidney had one younger brother, Joel Warren (deceased) and two half older brothers, James Webb and Nimrod Webb, both deceased.

Our father Never used the term HALF brothers to describe his two older brothers; they were BROTHERS.

Graduated from Orlando High School in 1948

Enlisted in the US Army after graduation and served until honorable discharge in 1955.

While serving in the Army he was station in Japan and missed being sent to Korea by a weekend pass

While processing out of the Army he met the love of his life: Our Mother Norma

A love affair and romance that lasted over 65 years.

That produced 3 children: William Mark Warren (Jane A.), Toby Patricia Deegan (Patrick) and Margaret Jane Reinalda.

Six grandchildren: Charles Sidney Warren (Sonja) , Tarah Deshler Cusimano (John), Sarah Beth-Ann Miller (Andrew), Gabrielle Elizabeth Everett (Matthew), Michelle Lee Deshler, Meaghan Dorman Rieth (Joseph), Christina Dorman Herbert (Mark), Stephen and Katie Kiefer and Bonnie Deegan

After separating from the Army in the spring 1955 and marrying the love of his life in August of that same year the next chapter of his life began in Columbus, Ohio.

He went to worked for North American Aviation as a test conductor on Air Force fighter planes. In November of 1956, his oldest child was born (William). After 3 snowy Ohio winters Dad had had enough and had a resume accepted by the Martin Company for a facility that they were building on the east coast of Florida.

So, in 1958 he packed up the family and moved south to warmer and greener pastures.

After 2 years of driving back and forth between east Orlando and Cape Canaveral, it was decided to move the family to a small town closer to his work.

Indian River City was the name. But in a few short years it was incorporated into the City of Titusville.

Not long after relocating to the east coast, the family expanded again with Patti in 1960 and Meg in 1961.

He graduated from Florida Technological College (UCF) 1972 with a BS in Business Administration.

There for the most part our parents lived their remaining adult life.

Dad retired from Martin Marietta Aerospace in 1993 with 32 years' service with the title Chief Estimator Canaveral Division.

The love of our father's life sadly passed away on June 10, 2019. From the day after our mothers service our father wanted nothing more than to be reunited with his BABE (his pet name for our mother).

That joyous moment occurred Sunday morning at 6:30am on January 10, 2021.

Goodbye, Farewell, Amen. Dad, we will miss you dearly, but rejoice in knowing you are where you wanted to be all along. We look forward to the day when all will join you. Mark, Patti, Meg, and family.
