Tom Ervin came into this world on April 1, 1944 and departed on July 30, 2020. Tom was born in Herrin, Ill to L.E. and Esther Ervin, their youngest child. His family moved to Cocoa, FL in the summer of 1960, where he graduated from Cocoa High School in 1962. He met and married his late wife, Barbara, in 1968 who blessed him with two children, Lisa Ervin Pollard (Mike) of Port St. John, FL and Maj. Brad Ervin (Mary) of Eielson AFB, AK. He became the father as well to Barbara's son, Johnny Fuentes (Terri) of Ocala, FL. Tom retired from AT&T after 32 years in Cocoa, and then worked in communications at the Cape for another 8 years before finally retiring in early 2009. He was also preceded in death by his parents, brothers Bob and Benny, his beloved sister Anita, and his "buddy", Ren. He is survived by his wife of almost 10 years, Sherry Cahill-Ervin, his three children and six grandchildren, Bryce and Kyle Ervin (Cincinnati, OH), Alexis and Marshall Ervin (Eielson AFB, AK), and Troy and Shane Pollard (Port St. John), as well as numerous nieces and nephews. They always thought of him as the "fun uncle" who was so good at pulling pranks on them, as well as the dad with the best place to play in the neighborhood. Everyone wanted to be at the Ervin house! Aside from his family, one of the things he was always most proud of was serving on the JUC Board at Lost Lakes, where he lived for 20 years, and volunteering for several years at the Sharing Center in Cocoa.
